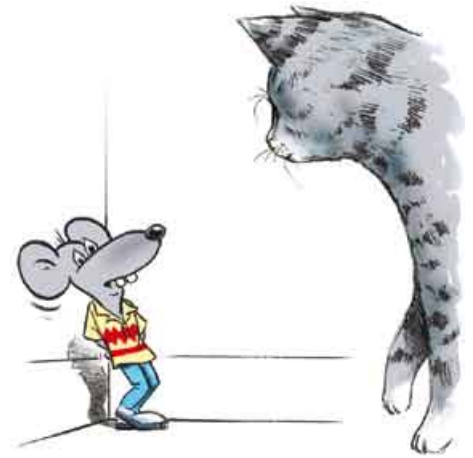
Work with a partner: Ask Terry's questions and give Emma's answers. Example:

**3 Tom Tiny's adventure**

He chased Tom through the shed and the garden. Tiger was very fast, so he almost caught poor Tom. But then Tom met a friend: Barker, Lisa's dog. Tom ran up to Barker, and Barker barked at Tiger. Tiger ran into the house again, and Barker and Tom went to Lisa's kitchen. There they found Barker's dog food on his plate and had a nice picnic together.

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## Lösungen:

## 1 b)

But then we **found** a beautiful crystal, and Terry **was** very nice to me again: "Here," he **said**. "This crystal is for you."
