3 The Fujita Scale

The Fujita Scale tells you the speed and the damage of tornadoes.

scale	wind speed	damage
F0	64–116 km/h	branches on trees break
F1	117–180 km/h	trees break; damage to roofs
F2	181–253 km/h	trees come out of the ground; roofs come off houses
F3	254–332 km/h	trains turn over; cars come off the ground
F4	333–418 km/h	houses are destroyed; cars fly 300m in the air
F5	419–512 km/h	the tornado blows whole houses or parts of houses away
