| <p>Celtic Britain</p> <p><i>Boudicca, a famous Celt ▶</i></p> <p>a druid</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Druids were religious leaders. - They were responsible for rites and sacrifices. <hr/> <p>Boudicca</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - She was the leader of the Iceni tribe and fought against the Romans. - She died in the year 60 AD or 61 AD. |  |
| <p>Roman Britain</p> <p>a soldier</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Only men over 20 could become Roman soldiers. - They were very tough and their leaders were very strict. <hr/> <p>a child</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rich families sent their boys to school or had a private teacher. - Girls could get married from the age of 12 and boys from age 14. |  |
| <p>Norman Britain</p> <p><i>William the Conqueror ▶</i></p> <p>a rich person</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Norman lords didn't speak English. - They lived in castles and often had huge feasts there. <hr/> <p>a poor person</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Most people in Norman Britain were poor. - They lived in simple huts and worked very hard for their lords. |  |
| <p>Tudor Britain</p> <p>a sailor</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Life at sea was exciting, but also very dangerous and tough. - Usually there wasn't any fresh food on the ships, so many sailors didn't get enough vitamins and became sick. <hr/> <p>a farmer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Most people were farmers in small villages. - The work was hard and started very early in the morning. |  |
| <p>Victorian Britain</p> <p><i>A Victorian lady and her butler ▶</i></p> <p>a servant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rich Victorian families often had a number of servants like cooks, nannies or butlers. <hr/> <p>a factory worker</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Victorian factories were loud, dark and dirty. People had to work long hours and child labour was very common. |  |

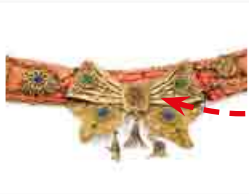
