

- 4. Make the rules. (die Regeln)
- 5. Make the game board. (das Spielbrett)





## Make a game.

Bastelt ein Spiel.

#### Group 1 Five steps to make the place cards

You need white paper (size A4), pencils, rulers, scissors and pens.

- 1. Cut out 32 cards. You can cut one piece of paper into eight.
- 2. Make four sets. Each set has eight cards.
- 3. Draw one of the eight places on each card.
- 4. Write the place name in English on the card too.
- 5. Do the same with the other three sets.

## **Group 2** Five steps to make 'Good luck' cards

You need green paper (size A4), pencils, rulers, scissors and pens.

- 1. Cut out eight cards. You can cut one piece of paper into eight.
- 2. What is 'good luck' for you? Think of eight situations.
- 3. Write down one situation on each card.
- 4. Decide how the player can go on. Make a list of eight ways.
- 5. Add one sentence to each card.

#### Group 3 Five steps to make 'Bad luck' cards

You need red paper (size A4), pencils, rulers, scissors and pens.

- 1. Cut out eight cards. You can cut one piece of paper into eight.
- 2. What is 'bad luck' for you? Think of eight situations.
- 3. Write down one situation on each card.
- 4. Decide how you can stop a player. Make a list of eight ways.
- 5. Add one sentence to each card.



## **Group 4** Five steps to make the rules

You need a poster, pencils, rulers, scissors and pens.

- 1. Read the rules.
- Do you understand everything? You can use your dictionary for help.
- 3. Write the rules on a poster.
- 4. Check your sentences.
- 5. Draw pictures to make the rules clear.

### **Group 5** Six steps to make the game board

You need white paper (size A4 with squares), pencils, rulers and felt-tips of different colours.

- 1. Divide the paper into squares: 9 x 6. Each square should be 3 cm x 3 cm.
- 2. Write 'Start' in the top left corner.
- 3. Draw the street to the town centre in the shape of a snail .

Look at the picture for help.

- Put the eight places in squares.You can draw pictures or write words.
- 5. Add eight 'Good luck' squares. Use a green 😥.
- 6. Add eight 'Bad luck' squares. Use a red (;).

Our town game

You need two to four players, a counter for each player and a coin.

Here are the rules:

- 1. Put your counters on 'Start'.
- 2. Toss the coin and move your counter: heads = 2 squares, tails = 1 square
- 3. If you land on a 'place'-take the place card.

  If you land on a 'hood luck' square or

  'Bod luck' soquare take a card, read it and do

  what it says. You can collect a place card if

  the 'hood luck' card or 'Bod luck' card sends

  you there. You can't collect a place card if you

  don't land on it.
- 4. Pass the coin to the next player.
- 5. The game ends when the first player gets to the final square. The winner is the person who has the most place cards.
