in California in 1849)

Biggest cities: Los Angeles, 3.8 million (metropolitan area 15 million);

San Diego, 1.4 million (metro area 3 million); San Jose, 1 million (metro area 7 million); San Francisco, 800,000 (metro area 4.2 million)

Economy: California is America's largest economy. Important industries: high

technology; agriculture; entertainment; tourism. If it were an independent

country, California would be the world's 7th largest economy.

Number of national parks: Eight: Channel Islands, Death Valley, Joshua Tree, Kings Canyon,

Lassen Volcanic, Redwood, Sequoia, Yosemite

Famous landmarks: San Francisco's cable cars, the Golden Gate Bridge, the Hollywood Sign
