Where is it?

Where is it? How to play the games.

Idea 1: Find the picture.
Find a partner. Cut out the cards and put them together. The text is on one side, the picture is on the other side. Find the map of the British Isles at the back of your book. Put it on the table.
Each player gets 16 cards. Put your cards in a pile and hold them in your hand so that you can read the text on the cards. Do not turn them round and keep them as they are. Do they match? Then you can turn them round again.

Idea 2: Who's the fastest?
Make groups of three students. Put the map of the British Isles on the table or the wall. Cut out the cards so that every text is a card and every picture is a card. Put the picture cards on the table so that you can see the text. Partner A and C: Find the right picture and put it in the right place on the map. Who's the fastest? Partner A: Have a look at the map at the back of your book. Is it the right picture and is it in the right place? Then the student (B or C) gets the two cards (text and picture). Now this student reads the next text to her or his partners. Is it wrong? Then the other student can find the right picture and read the next text. Who has the most cards in the end?


Idea 3: Find pairs.

Now B reads the text on her or his first card and A finds the picture on the map.
