It is Ben's birthday. You can go to his party. You miss 2 turns.

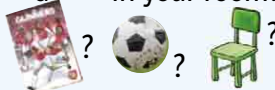


Or you can phone him and sing "Happy birthday to you!" Then you don't miss a turn.
