



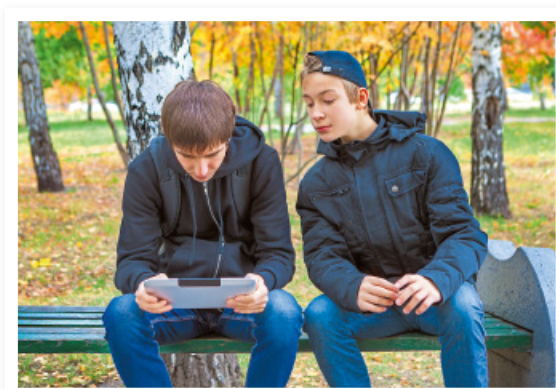
## Make a personality test!
