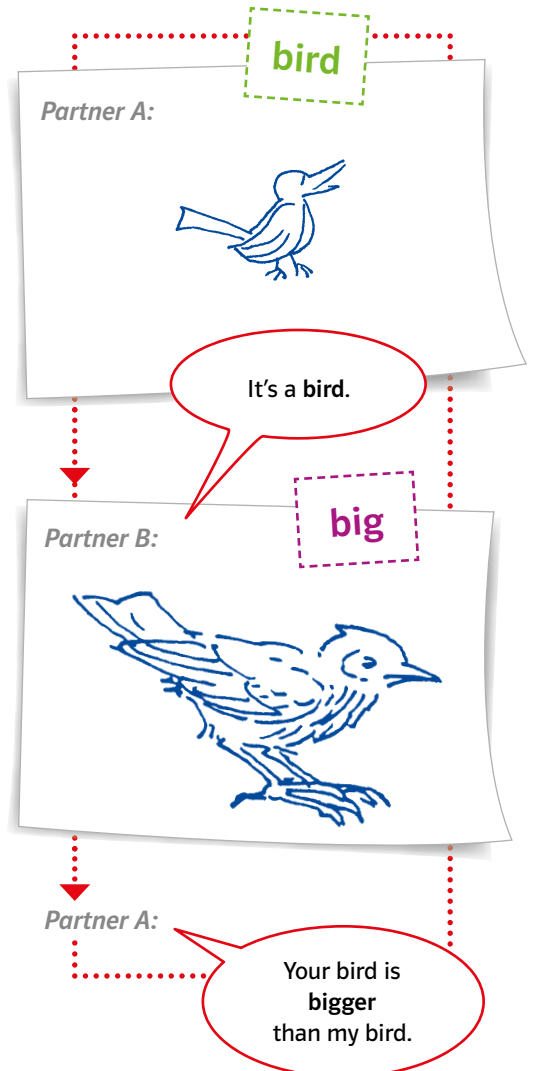


## Comparing animals

### 1 Draw it for me, please!



- a) • Cut out all the cards. Put the animal cards face down on one side of the table and the adjective cards on the other side.
- **Partner A:** Take an animal card. Don't show it to your partner. Draw the animal on a piece of paper. Your partner must guess which animal it is.
  - **Partner B:** Guess what animal your partner is drawing. When your partner says you're right, take one of the adjective cards. Don't show it to your partner. Draw another animal of the **same** kind. But your animal must match the adjective on your card.
- Example:** Your partner draws a bird. The adjective on your card says "big", so you draw a bigger bird.
- **Partner A:** Guess the adjective and use it in a sentence to compare the two animals.
- Example:** "Your bird is bigger than my bird."
- Now swap roles (Partner B takes an animal card, draws the animal and so on).
- b) Compare all your animal drawings from a) and decide which animal looks the happiest/the most colourful/...



### 2 Variation: Compare it for me, please!

You can use the cards for another game:

- Put the animal cards face up on the table. Take turns to choose two cards and think of an adjective to compare the two animals.
- Example:** „A bird is smaller than a dog.“
- Write the adjective down on a piece of paper. You can use each adjective only once per game.



If you want to make the game more difficult, put all cards face down at first. Turn over two of the cards when it's your turn.
